• Scavengers keep the ecosystem free of dead animals. Vultures (Fig. 1.20), jackals, hyenas, termites, and earthworms are some scavengers.

Decomposers Organisms that obtain nutrients by breaking down the remains of dead organic matter are called **decomposers**. Decomposers break down the dead or decaying organic matter into nutrients

such as nitrogen

and carbon, which in turn can be used by the living plants and animals.

Fungi (Fig. 1.21), and microorganisms such as bacteria, are examples of decomposers. Organisms that are too small to be seen with the naked eye are called **microorganisms**.

Jagdish Chandra Bose (*1858-1937*), an Indian scientist, made a number of discoveries related to plants.
