Does Oxford Advantage enable better skill development and help students in transferring skills and knowledge more effectively across disciplines?



Can Oxford Advantage help students in transferring skills and knowledge more effectively?

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About the impact study

Oxford Advantage is an integrated learning solution from OUP India, providing schools with a comprehensive suite of educational materials and services.

In 2018, an impact study* was undertaken to investigate how far **Oxford Advantage** enables students to effectively transfer their acquired skills and knowledge across disciplines.

The impact study findings were used to develop **Oxford Advantage** further and informed the development of similar courses. **Objective**: The overarching research question was whether *Oxford Advantage* enables better skill development and helps students in transferring skills and knowledge more effectively across disciplines.

Target participants: **48 teachers from 16 schools,** across 11 different states in India. At the time of the impact study, half of these 48 teachers were using **Oxford Advantage** for more than 1 year (existing users), whilst the other half was using it for less than 1 year (new users).

Methodology: A survey questionnaire with closed and open questions was used to interview.

To inform the overarching research question, three themes were explored:

- Cohesive link of themes across subjects, better learning, and more effective transfer of knowledge
- Application of skills acquired across the subjects
- Application of language and vocabulary acquired to engage with concepts across disciplines, thereby ensuring holistic development

*An impact study is research that investigates a particular change an OUP product or service has on the group of people it is intended to help or benefit.

Key findings

The impact study found that Oxford Advantage contributes towards a more holistic development of children.

All participants agreed that:

Oxford Advantage enables better skill development and helps students to transfer skills and knowledge more effectively across disciplines.

Oxford Advantage establishes a cohesive link of themes across subjects, resulting in better learning and more effective transfer of knowledge.

The impact study also indicated that:

Teachers feel it would be beneficial for parents to have a greater awareness about the advantages of a thematic learning program for their children.

Conclusion

This impact study found that, of those interviewed, the majority agreed that **Oxford Advantage's** cross-curricular approach to teaching/learning helps students transfer skills and knowledge more effectively across disciplines. Participants also agreed that **Oxford Advantage** establishes a cohesive link of themes across subjects, resulting in better learning and more effective transfer of knowledge. The results from this impact study fed into further development of **Oxford Advantage**, and also informed the development of similar courses.
